ORDER:

The Director of Backward Classes and Minorities Welfare and Director of Most Backward Classes and Denotified Communities have sent to Government Part II proposals for opening of 62 new School hostels for Boys/Girls for the year 1997-98. The Government accord sanction for an expenditure of Rs.169.47 lakhs (Rupees one hundred and sixty nine lakhs and forty seven thousand only) (Rs.126.42 lakhs recurring and Rs.43.05 lakhs non-recurring) being the ultimate cost for the opening of 62 new school hostels (Backward Classes Boys 20, Most Backward Classes Boys 10, Denotified Communities Boys 3, Backward Classes Girls 20, Most Backward Classes Girls 6 and Denotified Communities Girls 3. In the G.O. fourth read above orders have been issued for opening of 56 new hostels for Backward Classes, Most Backward Classes, Denotified Communities Boys/Girls. It was also ordered therein that in respect of remaining 6 hostels, orders will be issued separately.

2. In the Government letter No.1715/BC.I/93-17, Dated 5.9.94, Government have prescribed the following two criteria for opening of new hostels:-

- (1) There should not be more than 2 hostels in one block under Backward Classes and Most Backward Classes.
- (2) There should be no hostels existing for the same sex within 8 K.Ms for Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes Backward Classes and Most Backward Classes Welfare of the new hostel.

3. In the letters second and third read above the Director of Backward Classes and Minorities Welfare and Director of Most Backward Classes and Denotified Communities among others, have respectively informed that opening of hostels in the following six places are very essential since there is lot of demand for admission in the hostel in those places.

- (1) BC Girls Hostel at Sirkazhi in Nagai Quaid-e-Milleth District.
- (2) BC Girls Hostel at Thirupannanthai in Thanjavur District.
- (3) BC Girls Hostel at Kallakurichi in Villupuram Ramasamy Padayatchiar District.
- (4) MBC Girls Hostel at Perumpalai in Dharmapuri District
- (5) BC Boys Hostel at Thiyagadurgam in Villupuram Ramasamy Padayatchiar District.
- (6) MBC Boys Hostel at Karruppayurani in Madurai District.

However in as much as the Adi-Dravida Hostels for the same sex are available in those places, the Heads of Departments have informed the opening of the above six places will not be within the criteria prescribed by the Government. Therefore, the Heads of Departments requested the Government for sanctioning the opening of new hostels in the above six places by relaxing the relevant criteria.

4. The Government have examined the proposals of Director of Backward Classes and Director of Most Backward Classes and decided to relax the criteria prescribed by the Government in so far as relating to opening of the six new hostels referred to in para 3 above. Government accordingly sanctioned the opening of six new hostels indicated in the Annexure-II to this order.

5. The expenditure for the 62 hostels under Part-II during 1997-98 is restricted to Rs.168.39 lakhs to provide boarding and lodging facilities to the poor students of the weaker sections of the society to proceed their studies without any break. The strength of the each hostel will be 50 students.

6. The Government also sanction the employment of the staff for one year from the date of employment and incurring of other attendant item of expenditure both recurring and non-recurring as detailed in the Annexure-I to this order for 6 new hostels from the date of employment of staff, subject to the condition that the strength of the boarders of each hostel is maintained at the same level.

7. The staff will be eligible to draw in addition to their basic pay, the dearness allowance and other allowance at the rate admissible to them under the orders in force.

8. The Government also accord sanction for the supply of uniforms to the boarders at the rate of Rs.125/- (Rupees one hundred and twenty five only) per boarder in the High School hostels to be opened during 1997-98.

9. The Director of Backward Classes and Minorities Welfare and Director of Most Backward Classes and Denotified Communities are requested to arrange for the purchase of requisite variety of cloth in consultation with the Director of Handloom and Textiles, Chennai.

10. The Director of Handlooms and Textiles, Chennai is requested to assist the Director of Backward Classes and Minorities Welfare/Director of Most Backward Classes and Denotified Communities, Chennai in the purchase of the requisite varieties of cloth at the lowest rate possible, having regard to the bulk orders to be placed by the Director of Backward Classes and Minorities Welfare/Director of Most Backward Classes and Denotified Communities, Chennai as the clothes are intended for the supply to poor students.

11. The Director of Backward Classes and Minorities Welfare/Director of Most Backward Classes and Denotified Communities are informed that the Uniforms should be got stitched by the Tailoring units under the control of the Director of Social Welfare.

12. The expenditure shall be debited as follows:

Staff details and other items of expenditure of both
Directorate of Backward Classes and Minorities welfare and
Directorate of Most Backward Classes and Denotified Communities

- (1) 6 posts of B.Ed. grade Warden/Matron in the scale of Rs.1400-40-1600-50-2300-60-2600
(4 posts of Wardens/Matron under Director of Backward Classes and Minorities welfare and 2 posts of Warden/Matron under Director of Most Backward Classes and Denotified Communities)
- (2) 6 posts of Cooks on consolidated pay of Rs.500/- plus free meals for the period during which hostel functions.
(4 posts under Director of Backward Classes and Minorities Welfare and 2 posts under Director of Most Backward Classes and Denotified Communities)
- (3) 6 posts of helpers to assist cooks on a consolidate pay of Rs.100/- per month for the period during which the hostel functions.
(4 posts under Director of Backward Classes and Minorities Welfare and 2 posts under Director of Most Backward Classes and Denotified Communities)
- (4) 4 posts of watchman-cum-servant in the scale of pay of Rs.750-12-870-15-945 for the 4 girls hostel
(3 posts under Director of Backward Classes and Minorities Welfare and one post under Director of Most Backward Classes and Denotified Communities)
- (5) Food charges at Rs.180/- per student for all boarders per month from the date of opening of hostels for the period during which the hostel functions.
- (6) Rent not exceeding Rs.1500/- (Rupees one thousand and five hundred only) per month per hostel. The rent sanctioned is provisional and the actual rent should be fixed in consultation with public works Department authorities.

- (7) Vessels, furniture and 22 litre Cooker and amenities for hostel at the rate of Rs.60,000/- (Rupees Sixty thousand only) per hostel.
- (8) Expenditure regarding setting up of Mini Library at Rs.2000/- per hostel.
- (9) Mats at the rate of Rs.20/- (Rupees twenty only) per boarder.
- (10) A wet Grinder at a cost not exceeding Rs.6500/- (Rupees six thousand and five hundred only) per hostel.
- (11) Supply of News papers viz. 'The Hindu', 'The Dinamani' and 'Murasoli' to all the 6 Hostels.
- (12) Miscellaneous expenditure of Rs.10/- per boarder per month from the date of opening of hostels for the period during which the hostel functions.

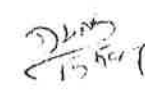
